

Rules of the Polish House in Paris during the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad

hereinafter referred to as “House Rules”

1. General information

- 1.1. Poland House is located in the Pavillon Royal building, where during the Games of the XXXIII Olympiad in Paris events related to the course of the Games, the participation of Polish athletes and accompanying events will take place. The pavilion is located at Carrefour du bout des lacs, 1 Rte de la Muette à Neuilly, 75116 Paris, France.
- 1.2. Poland House is operated and managed by Polski Komitet Olimpijski, ul. Wybrzeże Gdyńskie 4, 01-531 Warszawa (hereinafter referred to as “PKOL” or “Organiser”). PKOL may authorise designated persons to perform certain organisational and managerial activities on behalf of PKOL.
- 1.3. These House Rules set out the rules for entry to Poland House, the rules for staying on the premises and apply to activities and attractions available during the operation of Poland House.

- 1.5. Each person entering the premises of Poland House is required to comply with the House Rules. If any violation of the House Rules is found, the Organiser will be entitled to remove the violator from the premises of Poland House. A person staying at Poland House may also be referred to as a “Guest”.
- 1.6. Poland House will be open from 27 July to 11 August 2024, from 2:00 pm to 10:00 pm. On the opening day, i.e. 26 July 2024, Poland House will be open from 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm.
- 1.7. At Poland House:
 - 1.7.1. broadcasts of the Olympic Games will be conducted;
 - 1.7.2. various events and attractions related to the promotion of Poland and sports and the Polish Olympic movement will be held, including activities of an entertaining nature, such as an Olympic knowledge quiz and games on the field;
 - 1.7.3. panel discussions and meetings with sports stars will be held;
 - 1.7.4. exhibitions of works by Polish artists will be presented.
- 1.8. Information about Poland House is available on the website at <https://dompolski.pkol.pl/> (hereinafter referred to as “Website”).

2. Entry to the Poland House

- 2.1. Poland House can be visited only with a valid entry ticket. The ticket grants access to Poland House and the adjacent garden. Whenever there is reference in these House Rules to Poland House, it should be understood to include the area of the abovementioned garden.
- 2.2. The price of entry is PLN 130 or EUR 30. Tickets can be purchased through the website at 1.tickets-dompolski.pl (hereinafter referred to as the “Sales Site”). At the same time, for each day of the 17 days for which tickets can be purchased, the above mentioned address

will start with a digit denoting the next number, i.e. tickets for the first day will be available at the address 1.tickets-dompolski.pl, for the second day 2.tickets-dompolski.pl, for the third day 3.tickets-dompolski.pl and so on.

- 2.3. Children under the age of 9 can enter Poland House free of charge with its Parent/Legal Guardian's ticket.
- 2.4. For children and minors aged between 9 and 18, the entry price is PLN 65 or EUR 15.
- 2.5. Ticket prices for a given day may increase depending on the attractions provided by the Organiser on that day. Information about the increase in the price of tickets will be given well in advance.
- 2.6. Only adults may purchase tickets, and minors for whom tickets have been purchased must be on the premises of Poland House under the supervision of a Parent/Legal Guardian.
- 2.7. In order to purchase a ticket, it is necessary to register and create an account on the Sales Site. In order to register and create an account, it is necessary to provide your first name, last name, e-mail address and billing or invoicing address. Having an account allows you to access an app containing information about the programme of the day at the Olympic House, for which you have purchased an entry ticket.
- 2.8. The above mentioned account is delivered by Gridaly Sp. z o.o., with its registered office in Warsaw, ul. Nowogrodzka 64/ 43, 02-014 Warszawa, KRS: 0000893606, which, with respect to the account, will act as a separate controller of personal data under the terms described on the Sales Site.
- 2.9. Purchase of tickets through the Sales Site and entry to Poland House takes place as follows:
 - 2.9.1. in order to purchase a ticket, it is necessary to register on the Sales Site, which requires providing the name, surname, e-mail address and address of the buyer (address for billing/invoicing purposes) and the names and e-mail addresses of the persons other than the buyer to whom tickets are to be assigned, if the buyer is also purchasing tickets for those other persons;
 - 2.9.2. select the date on which the ticket should entitle you to enter;
 - 2.9.3. after the purchase, the buyer will receive a message with a link to the QR code to the email address provided at registration;
 - 2.9.4. at the entrance to Poland House, using your smartphone or a printout, present the QR code to receive a wristband signifying your authorisation to enter Poland House;
- 2.10. With a one-day ticket, you can enter the Premises only once. This means that if you leave Poland House, you cannot enter it again on that day with the same ticket.
- 2.11. One person can purchase any number of tickets.
- 2.12. Multi-day tickets, e.g. for athletes and media, entitle them to multiple entries to Poland House.
- 2.13. Each ticket is personal, which means that it is assigned to a person's name and surname.
- 2.14. The entry ticket entitles the holder to stay in certain areas corresponding to its scope.

- 2.15. Resale of tickets is prohibited. It is also forbidden to offer or advertise the resale of tickets, whether through the Internet, newspapers, ticket stores or other means. It is also prohibited to provide tickets to third parties in connection with or as part of any other product or service. In the event that a ticket is found to have been purchased second-hand (i.e., a person in whose name it was purchased does not have such a ticket), the Organiser is entitled not to honour such a ticket and not to allow the ticket holder to enter the Poland House.
- 2.16. Tickets are sold until the pool of tickets available for the day is exhausted, namely 700 tickets.
- 2.17. Tickets may not be used for advertising, promotion, auction or marketing purposes (including contests, competitions, prizes, etc.). Tickets used for such purposes will be invalidated.
- 2.18. Tickets may not be purchased by any other means or from any entities other than those indicated in these House Rules. Tickets purchased in a manner other than that specified in these House Rules do not entitle the holder to enter Poland House.
- 2.19. Tickets that are sold, offered or advertised for sale in violation of these House Rules will be invalidated. It will not be possible to exchange or refund the money already paid for the invalidated tickets.
- 2.20. Persons entering Poland House may be asked to present their identity document.
- 2.21. Apart from the ticket, each buyer will receive from the Organiser a discount code for an Adidas brand product. The code will be sent to the email address provided when purchasing the tickets.
- 2.22. Tickets are not refundable.
- 2.23. A ticket purchased for a given person remains assigned to that very person. This means that no person other than the person to whom the ticket was assigned at the time of purchase can enter with that ticket.

3. Rules of staying at Poland House

- 3.1. Persons staying at Poland House are obliged to behave in a cultured way and in accordance with good manners and rules of social intercourse.
- 3.2. It is forbidden to disturb the peace and cause danger to the persons staying at Poland House.
- 3.3. Guests are required to observe all safety rules of Poland House.
- 3.4. If the Organiser or persons designated by the Organiser find that a guest behaves in a manner contrary to the House Rules, the Organiser may admonish or remove such person from the Poland House. In this case, such a person loses the right to stay at the Polish House despite having a ticket.
- 3.5. Access to Poland House is strictly limited to the hours and areas indicated in these House Rules.
- 3.6. It is forbidden to bring into the area of Poland House:

- 3.6.1. alcoholic beverages;
- 3.6.2. drugs;
- 3.6.3. weapons of any kind;
- 3.6.4. explosives;
- 3.6.5. containers for spraying gases, corrosive or colouring substances;
- 3.6.6. sports equipment and accessories;
- 3.6.7. own food and drink except:
 - 3.6.7.1. water in original sealed plastic bottles;
 - 3.6.7.2. food for consumption for legitimate medical reasons;
 - 3.6.7.3. food and beverages for infants;
- 3.6.8. animals;
- 3.6.9. wireless devices: radios, drones, jammers, unauthorised wireless routers;
- 3.6.10. objects that emit excessive noise: megaphones, vuvuzelas, horns, loudspeakers or musical instruments;
- 3.6.11. professional cameras (only cameras with lenses shorter than 20 mm are allowed);
- 3.6.12. personal transportation, electrical or other equipment (this does not include assistive devices for the disabled persons);
- 3.6.13. banners and signs, including signs or banners with religious or political content;
- 3.7. Smoking tobacco and other substances, use of drugs and consumption of alcohol other than alcohol provided by the Organiser is prohibited on the premises of Poland House.
- 3.8. Guests are responsible for any damage caused by themselves and persons under their custody. None of the provisions of these House Rules shall limit the liability of Guests as provided by the relevant laws.
- 3.9. A Guest is responsible for the items brought to Poland House. Neither PKOL nor the Organiser shall be responsible for loss, damage or theft of items brought by the Guest.
- 3.10. Guests may be subjected to security checks at the entrance to Poland House, including scanning of bags, backpacks, etc. If a Guest refuses to submit to a security check, he or she will not be allowed to enter Poland House or will be forced to leave Poland House immediately. In such a situation, the Guest will not be entitled to a refund for the ticket and to any other claims.
- 3.11. The Organiser reserves the right to require the presentation of a ticket when leaving Poland House.

4. Attractions at the Poland House

- 4.1. Snacks as well as alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages will be available for guests of Poland House. Alcoholic beverages will be available for adults only (staff may require presentation

of an identity document). The availability of snacks and beverages may depend on the level of attendance.

- 4.2. A quiz on Olympic Games and sports knowledge will be held at Poland House.
- 4.3. The quiz will be held under the following rules:
 - 4.3.1. questions on the knowledge of the Olympic Games and sports will be asked;
 - 4.3.2. a participant answers the question that is displayed on the screen;
 - 4.3.3. a participant can take part in the quiz alone or against another person;
 - 4.3.4. the quiz is of an educational nature, therefore there is no prize for correct answers.
- 4.4. Sports games will be held on the field adjacent to Poland House. Participation in those games is at the participants' own risk. Games and activities will be held under the supervision of persons designated by PKOL. Basketball, tennis, volleyball and other games will be provided for.
- 4.5. Any person visiting Poland House can get a temporary tattoo on their body in the form of a washable print. Such a person must be at least 18 years old and have full legal capacity.
- 4.6. The above-mentioned tattoos are, as a rule, safe. All ingredients are registered with the US FDA VCRP database (FDA's Voluntary Cosmetic Registration Program) and the EU CPNP database (EU Cosmetic Product Notification Portal), and have been tested like standard cosmetic products; however, adverse skin reactions cannot be ruled out. A tattoo may be placed on a person's skin only at the person's own risk. The Organiser is not responsible for adverse skin reactions of those who had the above tattoo placed on their body.
- 4.7. The Organiser may refuse to place a tattoo on a person's skin if a person behaves in a manner contrary to the rules of social intercourse.

5. Photography and filming

- 5.1. The Organiser or third parties authorised by the Organiser may take photos and record video footage within the premises of Poland House. By entering Poland House, a Guest agrees to be photographed and filmed by the Organiser or authorised third parties. A Guest agrees that his/her image recorded in the above manner may be disseminated without remuneration and without time or territorial restrictions by the Organiser and by authorised persons for the purpose of reporting on the events and activities of Poland House and in connection with the promotion of Polish sports and the Olympic movement in all media.
- 5.2. While staying at Poland House, a Guest can take photos or record moving images or sounds. However, a Guest may use such photos and recordings only for personal, private, non-commercial and non-promotional purposes. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a Guest shall not transmit or distribute (or otherwise make available to third parties) any moving images or sounds taken or recorded at Poland House via television, radio, the Internet (including on social media and through live streaming) or any other electronic media,

whether existing now or created in the future using new technologies, without the prior consent of PKOL.

- 5.3. In the designated no-photography and restricted-access areas in Poland House, it is prohibited to take photos and make any recordings, including video and sound recordings.

6. Responsibilities

- 6.1. The Organiser shall not be responsible for the lack of possibility to enter the Polish House or failure to perform other obligations in cases where such failure is due to causes, in accordance with relevant regulations, not attributable to it, in particular in cases of force majeure.
- 6.2. Force majeure shall mean any event or circumstance beyond the control of the Organiser, including but not limited to: cancellation or postponement of the Games, industrial or civil disputes, war, governmental actions, riots, fire, flood, drought, other natural disasters, public disturbances caused by spectators, civil unrest, military operations, explosions, structural damage, terrorism (including the threat of terrorism), pandemics and epidemics, laws, regulations, guidelines, rulings or omissions of relevant administrative authorities, shortage or failure of energy supply, strikes, lockouts, boycotts or other labour actions ("**Force Majeure Event**").
- 6.3. In the case of a Force Majeure Event, the Organiser shall, to the extent possible, promptly inform (including by posting information on the Website) of the nature and probable duration of the Force Majeure Event and make efforts to mitigate its effects.

7. Personal data

- 7.1. The information clause on the processing of personal data can be found in Appendix 1 to these House Rules.

8. Final provisions

- 8.1. The Organiser shall be entitled to amend these House Rules in case of a justified need, in particular due to organisational and security considerations.
- 8.2. To the fullest extent permissible by law, the provisions of Polish law shall apply to these House Rules, matters governed by them and matters in connection with the House Rules.

Appendix 1

information clause on the processing of personal data

1. Polski Komitet Olimpijski (Polish Olympic Committee) based in Warsaw ("**PKOL**" or "**We**") shall be the controller of personal data. Our contact details: Polski Komitet Olimpijski, ul. Wybrzeże Gdyńskie 4, 01-531 Warszawa, e-mail: pkol@pkol.pl.

2. PKOL shall process personal data in accordance with the provisions of Regulation (EU) No 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (“**GDPR**”).
3. PKOL shall process personal data for the following purposes and on the following legal basis:
 - a. ticket sales, as the processing is necessary for the performance of a contract to which the data subject is a party (Article 6(1)(b) of GDPR);
 - b. performance of PKOL’s legal obligations (Article 6(1)(c) of GDPR), including maintaining tax and accounting records in accordance with applicable tax and accounting regulations (including: the Tax Ordinance Act of 29 August 1997, the Accounting Act of 29 September 1994 and the VAT Act of 11 March 2004);
 - c. pursuit of its legitimate interest (Article 6(1)(f) of RODO), consisting in:
 - i. the organisation of the Polish House and related events;
 - ii. ensuring security and order in the premises of the Polish House;
 - iii. carrying out promotional activities by means of dissemination of the image recorded on photos and films for the purpose of reporting on events and activities of the Polish House and in connection with the promotion of Polish sports and the Olympic movement in all media;
 - iv. establishing, pursuing and defending against claims.
4. Provision of data is necessary for the purchase of tickets, and failure to do so will result in the inability to purchase tickets and thus to enter the Poland House.
5. The period of processing of personal data by PKOL depends on the purpose of personal data processing. As a rule:
 - a. personal data provided in connection with the purchase of tickets will be kept for a period necessary for the organisation of the Polish House;
 - b. personal data necessary for tax and accounting records will be kept until the statute of limitations for taxation, which is currently 5 years;
 - c. personal data processed for the purposes of pursuing PKOL’s legitimate interest will be kept for the period of existence of this interest or until an effective objection is made to the processing of data for these purposes or, in the case of sending marketing information, until the withdrawal of consent to receive them;
 - d. the period of processing of personal data may be extended in case it is necessary for the establishment and assertion of claims or defence against possible claims, and thereafter only if and to the extent required by law.
6. Recipients of personal data may be entities providing services to PKOL, including providers of IT services and solutions, entities providing accounting services, entities providing legal, auditing, consulting services, marketing agencies. Data may also be disclosed to courts and public authorities in order to comply with legal obligations.
7. PKOL will not transfer personal data outside the European Economic Area or to international organisations.
8. Individuals have the right to:
 - a. obtain confirmation as to whether their personal data is being processed, as well as the right to access their personal data processed by PKOL and to obtain a copy thereof;
 - b. rectify incorrect or incomplete personal data;

- c. demand the removal of personal data;
 - d. demand the restriction of personal data processing;
 - e. transfer of personal data when it is processed on the basis of consent or in connection with the performance of a contract;
 - f. object, at any time, to the processing of personal data on grounds related to the person's particular situation, as well as to object without having to justify it in the case of processing for marketing purposes.
 - g. where a person has consented to the processing of personal data or to receive certain information from PKOL (e.g., marketing information), the person may also, at any time, withdraw their consent, whereby the withdrawal of consent will not affect the legality of the processing of personal data or other actions performed by PKOL prior to the withdrawal of consent.
9. Personal data is not used to make automated decisions, including profiling.
10. In connection with the need to register on the Site, a separate data controller for the account maintained on the ticket purchasing platform will be Gridaly Sp. z o.o. with its registered office in Warsaw, ul. Nowogrodzka 64/ 43, 02-014 Warszawa Information on the processing of personal data by this entity is made available on the Site.
